Advent and Christmas

We have one month to go in 2022. However, according to the church year/calendar, we just started a new year with Advent. Happy New Year!

Advent marks the beginning of the church year, and it begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day and ends on Christmas Eve. If Christmas Day falls on a Sunday, like this year, Advent will last four full weeks. If Christmas Day falls on any other day of the week, Advent will last less than four weeks.

Then, what is 'Advent'? Advent comes from the Latin word *adventus* and the meaning coming or visit. So, we practice Advent as we expect Jesus' coming. It is a season for Christians to prepare for the coming of Christ in various meanings:

- * The promised coming of the Messiah to the Jews
- *The coming of Jesus being born in Bethlehem
- *The promised return of the risen Christ in final victory
- *The continual coming of Christ into the lives and hearts of believers

So, Advent is a season of 'waiting' for the coming of Christ, and we celebrate and remember Advent based on these scriptures.

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life" (John 3:16)

"The Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth" (John 1:14).

We celebrate and remember the past event that God sent Jesus to save us and the future hope when Jesus will come again as the King of kings and the Lord of lords.




