2023 Expense Budget is available upon request.

Restricted Accounts: Going forward, a process will be in place to request / approve creating new restricted accounts. If a Restricted Account is no longer active, a process to identify, recommend resolutions and review by Church Council will be established.

The Finance Committee continues to discuss areas for cost savings in relation to the Operating Expenses. Year to date Expenses is higher than Unrestricted Income (see information below)

Reminder: Tax Exemption Certificate – available from Church Office for qualifying purchases Encourage reporting of expenses and requests for reimbursement be made in a timely manner.

Financial Planning workshops in 2024 – beginning in January, financial education sessions will be provided by members of our church to help individuals with personnel financial awareness, long term planning, etc. This was available several years ago and we believe it is time to offer this training opportunity once again. More information will be provided when available.


Coming Soon- SPUMC Card Ministry


