New Year's Resolution

Greetings, St. Paul UMC family and friends!

We are in February 2023. We have spent 31 days of the new year. I don't know about you, but we are still in a 'NEW' year's situation to me. We must realize and acknowledge that this New Year, 2023 comes to us only once in our lifetime. Nobody in this world can have the year 2023 more than once. We will not get the year 2023 again....never. So, I'd like to ask you these questions; what is your new year's resolution? How would you live this year? What is your plan or hope for this year? Health? Money? Relationship? Work? Family? Or.....God?

I encourage you to work out your own salvation this year. I want all of us to have this in our new year's resolution. John Wesley published "The Nature, Design, and General Rules of the United Societies" in 1743. He wrote it to help people of the United Society who tried to follow his teachings. The General Rules he set were "Do no harm, Do good, Attend all ordinances of God." So, as United Methodist Church people, this rule is like our gym equipment to help us to be healthy and strong as Christians. Based on Jesus' great commandment (Mark 12:30-31; Matthew 22:34-40; Luke 10:25-37) and "New Commandment" (John 13:34-35), we need to move our body, and we need to implant this 'love' into our lives as we do no harm, do good, and attend all ordinances of God.

As we cannot get strong overnight, it would take time to get strong and healthy. We would experience many things, such as joy, happiness, and failure. Moreover, we will experience 'progress' (growth) because it's a life journey with God's help. In this journey, we are not perfect, we are still sinners in this world, and we need God's grace and love to live our lives in this world. We need God's grace more and more. Just imagine pouring clean water into a cup of muddy water. It takes time to be transformed into clean water. It takes time. Don't push or demand too much; stay patient and walk with God's help. We have examples in the Bible; To transform the disciples of Jesus, Jesus needed to spend three years with them. And they became true disciples of Jesus because of God's help (when they received the Holy Spirit).

Let's work out our salvation together in 2023. I hope and pray that we can say, "I have been growing this year as I worked out my salvation with the General rule," when we send out Christmas cards to our family and friends later this year.

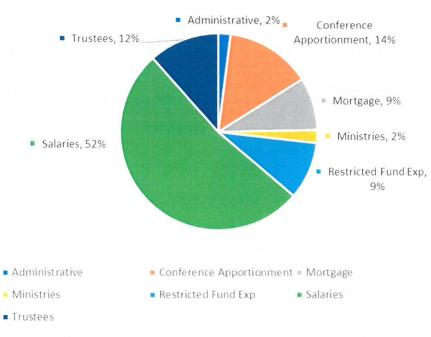

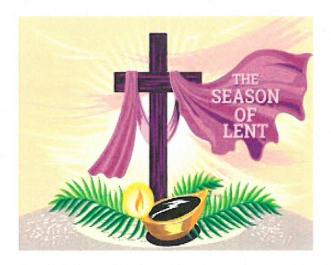

Shoeboxes are not being collected due to the great supply on hand.

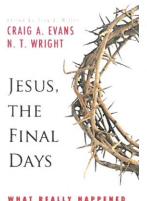
