

Greetings, St. Paul UMC family!

I pray that everyone and yours are doing well.

We are in February. February is known as 'Love Month' due to Valentine's Day and 'Black History Month.' In addition to that, we have 'Ash Wednesday' -the first day of Lent- this year (2/14). As we are having a spiritual journey together, let's think about Lent. Lent is a season of the Christian year where Christians focus on simple living, prayer, and fasting in order to grow closer to God. It's the 40 days before Easter. Lent excludes Sundays because every Sunday is like a little Easter. It's about one-tenth of a year (like a tithe of time). Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and is a 40-day spiritual journey from Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday.

For me, Lent is a "season of spiritual cultivating." Just as a farmer begins the year's work by plowing his fields in the spring, I've been working through Lent to plow the fields of my heart with the plow of God's Word. As farming takes time, I've been cultivating myself before God for years, and now I'm constantly changing and growing before God. Forty days is not short; sometimes, I feel exhausted, but I try to remind myself that this is God's way of cultivating my life. But it's not that I can earn God's favor through my own efforts, but that it is my humble little struggle to seek God's deep grace.

In the Lenten season, we will be reading the Gospels each day, and you can take a break from chocolate or certain foods or behaviors you have been working on for yourself. Stop doing something is not the only thing you can do in Lent. You can also do more. We have worked on 'Discipleship' on Sundays. Why don't we apply it to the Lenten Season this year? Attend all the Lenten Services in person or online, pray 5 times a day, read the Gospels according to the schedule, serve two persons per week, save changes to give, share God's words, love, and work with one person weekly, and invite others to St. Paul UMC. All of this is about participating in God's work as God's people because God works in the world through you and me, through people. God's work happens in the world when we set priorities, move our bodies, spend time with others, and lay down ourselves for others. I pray for you this Lenten season that God fills your life with grace and overflows to others.

I mentioned the 'season of spiritual cultivating' earlier. We cultivate our garden with a hope for the future: an abundance. We plow up the ground that doesn't have anything yet. We do this work because of the future. From this perspective of preparation, I will take a 'renewal leave' this year. UMC clergy are encouraged to care for themselves as they have 3 months of 'renewal leave (sabbatical)' every 7 years of full-time ministry. I have served as a full-time UMC clergy member for 9 years. So, I'm eligible to do it, and DS approved me to do it this year. I decided to do it this year because, over the last three years, I have gone through challenges and changes with St. Paul UMC. And it is time to renew and refresh myself for the future ministry. I split these 3 three months into two: the whole month of April (30 days) and from 6/28 to 8/22 (60 days). I'll come back and preach on 8/25. We have clergy and lay people to preach during that time. We will have an on-call pastor who will provide pastoral care when you need it. The St. Paul UMC leaders will continue to do ministry and serve God and God's people with you all. Lastly, please keep me in your prayers so I can come back as refreshed and renewed. I cannot do it without your support because we are a team. We will continue to move on with God's help and guidance.

FEBRUARY

We still have time to set up our minds on how to spend this year's Lenten season. Please pray about it with a willing heart, the love God has shown you, and gratitude. God will speak and lead you in God's way. Once you get an idea, be strong and courageous and do it!

And as the St. Paul UMC family, let's keep up the good work for the Kingdom of God as we try to be sensitive to read God's wind now and down the road.

Finance Policy

Unrestricted Funds

Income and contributions used to maintain the church facilities, pay mortgage, utilities, office related expenses, salary and expenses for administrative / janitorial / pastoral staff, educational materials, conference apportionments and other costs to support the routine business of St Paul United Methodist Church.

Restricted Funds

Contributions made which designate a specific purpose. Restricted Fund balances are managed separate from the Unrestricted (or General Operating) Funds.

Restricted Funds at St Paul United Methodist Church include:

Altar Flowers Angel Tree Building Fund (incl Parsonage Proceeds)

Compassion Children Heartfelt (Operation Backpack) Kitchen Ministry

Library Fund Media Team Missions

Passion Plan Safe Nights Operation Christmas Child (shoebox)

SMILE UMYF Vacation Bible School

Worship Pastor Discretionary Fund

Restricted Funds will be used for activities before being applied to the General / Unrestricted Funds.

Process to add / remove Restricted Fund at St Paul United Methodist Church:

The addition or removal of a Restricted Fund will be made by the Church Council. Recommendations will be presented by the Finance Committee Chair at the monthly Church Council meeting, and it will be voted on by the Church Council to either add a new Restricted Fund or remove an existing Restricted Fund.

<u>New Restricted Funds</u> will be created only after review and approval is made by the Finance Committee. This will include a description of the requested fund and primary sponsor for fund activities.

<u>Removal of an existing Restricted Fund</u> – a recommendation will be made by the Finance Committee which will include a reason the fund will be removed and a recommendation of how any remaining fund dollars will be managed. The remaining balances for a fund being eliminated may be moved into another Restricted Fund.

Restricted Fund dollars will always be managed separately from the Unrestricted / General Operating Funds of the church.


