Happy New Year!

We are now living in a new year, 2024. It makes me wonder. People say it's a new year, a new time, but what's new? Did a day suddenly become 25 hours long instead of 24 starting this year? No, we will live the same length as last year - a day is only 24 hours, and an hour is only 60 minutes. As you know, after this winter comes spring, and then summer and fall, so why is it a "new" year?

It's because our mind is new, and we have new expectations. Without that new mind, no matter how many dozens of new years we have or how much new time we have, it's just a continuation of the past. Often, many resolutions last only three days because they were made without a new mind.

We keep resolutions or any other plans we make for the future that need to be done with a new mind. From the outside, everything looks the same every day, every month. That is why our hearts help us start things, change things, and go on. So, how do we renew our minds? Paul tells us in Romans 12:2.

"Do not be conformed to this age, but be transformed by the renewing of the mind, so that you may discern God's will—what is good and acceptable and perfect."

Here, Paul describes "imitating this generation" and "renewing your mind" as opposing concepts. The implication is that our minds can never be renewed while we are imitating this generation. So, let's first look at what it means to "imitate this generation" so that we can start the New Year with a fresh mind.

The Message translation puts it this way. "Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what he wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops well-formed maturity in you."

People teach us that to be successful in this world, we must conform to the culture of this world. They tell us to think like everyone else thinks and live like everyone else lives. They say that a successful life is one in which you not only fit into the culture of this world but can lead the culture of this world even more than others. But Paul's teaching is the opposite: instead of trying to live according to the ways of the people of this world, he tells us to set our eyes on God first, to think about what God wants us to do. Then, he says, change comes from within, and the "inward change" is the "new heart. A new heart readily recognizes and accepts God's will for us, and we don't hesitate to do it. It means that we must make sure that we don't allow the old ways to creep into the present and continue to influence us. Or we will never truly experience newness, no matter how many times we welcome a new year.

Proverbs 4:23 says, "Keep your heart with all vigilance, for from it flow the springs of life." I pray that the new year of 2024 will be one in which we receive and enjoy the blessings of God's renewal.


GIFT CARDS
