- Community-

From July, 2022, I start my third year of ministry at the St. Paul UMC. I've been blessed by God because of you. I can testify how God has worked with us all. I believe that St. Paul UMC is a wonderful and great faith community.

As I enter the third year of ministry with you, I pray that our faith as a community will grow deeper. So, I'd like to share about 'community/church' with you.

I often find people who treat their faith as private and say that "I have faith in God but don't need a church or help from people", or "God knows everything, I don't have to tell you what I need or prayer request" Yes that's true. God knows everything and the scripture says, "For your Father knows what you need before you ask him" (Matthew 6:8) But if you believe in that statement only, you should know and learn this truth also: One of the highest calling for us from God is that building a healthy community. In other words, having a relationship with others.

I want to share this illustration with you first.

A terrible storm came into a town and local officials sent out an emergency warning that the riverbanks would soon overflow and flood the nearby homes. They ordered everyone in the town to evacuate immediately.

A faithful Christian man heard the warning and decided to stay, saying to himself, "I will trust God and if I am in danger, then God will send a divine miracle to save me."

The neighbors came by his house and said to him, "We're leaving and there is room for you in our car, please come with us!" But the man declined. "I have faith that God will save me."

As the man stood on his porch watching the water rise up the steps, a man in a canoe paddled by and called to him, "Hurry and come into my canoe, the waters are rising quickly!" But the man again said, "No thanks, God will save me."

The floodwaters rose higher pouring water into his living room and the man had to retreat to the second floor. A police motorboat came by and saw him at the window. "We will come up and rescue you!" they shouted. But the man refused, waving them off saying, "Use your time to save someone else! I have faith that God will save me!"

The flood waters rose higher and higher and the man had to climb up to his rooftop. A helicopter spotted him

and dropped a rope ladder. A rescue officer came down the ladder and pleaded with the man, "Grab my hand and I will pull you up!" But the man STILL refused, folding his arms tightly to his body. "No thank you! God will save me!"

Shortly after, the house broke up and the floodwaters swept the man away and he drowned. When in Heaven, the man stood before God and asked, "I put all of my faith in You. Why didn't You come and save me?" And God said, "Son, I sent you a warning. I sent you a car. I sent you a canoe. I sent you a motorboat. I sent you a helicopter. What more were you looking for?"

What do you see in this illustration? I see the purpose of the community. I see how God answers our prayers through people. I know all of you believe in God and have been praying for something or someone important in your life. Of course, God can make miraculous things for you directly to answer your prayer. God is almighty. God can do anything. God will show you divine miracles. Right? But as we expect God's divine supernatural power, we also need to expect God's divine power that comes through people's hearts and lives around us.

Let me tell you how it happens. God binds us as a community with God's love. Do you know why? Because God made us in that way. Let me give you the first and most important reason. We believe in the triune God; Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, distinct but inseparable, eternally one in essence and power, One God who is three persons. The Bible doesn't have the term, 'Trinity' but we can think of Trinitarian God from the Bible. In the creation story in the book of Genesis, we can find the triune God. God's spirit was hovering over the water (Genesis 1:1). When God created man, God said, 'Let us make man in our image, after our likeness (Genesis 1:26).' The Bible uses plural words, 'us' and 'our'.

So, we can easily think that there were more being besides God. So the glimpse of our understanding of the triune God tells us that our God is relational and communal. And this relational and communal God made us follow God's way. Therefore, making a good community, church, or having a good relationship with others is one of our highest callings and our natural tendency.

The Trinitarian understanding of God tells us that it is very difficult to know our God fully without being in a community and sharing life with other believers. The Trinitarian understanding of God shows us how to treat one another. This understanding of God denies any kinds of abusive human relationships but promotes respect for human dignity. Thus, the more I love the Triune God, the more I can love others.

Ecclesiastes 4:9-12 says, "Two are better than one because they have a good reward for their toil. For if they fall, one will lift up his fellow; but woe to him who is alone when he falls and has not another to lift him up. Again, if two lie together, they are warm; but how can one be warm alone? And though a man might prevail against one who is alone, two will withstand him. A threefold cord is not quickly broken." The Apostle Paul said, "For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ" (1 Corinthians 12:12). We are different but we are connected as one body. This is the church and body of Jesus Christ.

We are Jesus Christ's body. We are all connected to God's body. We are one. I pray that we can make more strong community by God's grace in the coming year. So that God's name will be glorified by our community/church.

"A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; even as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." John 13:34-35







Gardeners who've dealt with inhospitable conditions can relate especially well to Jesus' parable of the sower. Drought, invasive critters and thorny weeds often seem to conspire against growers' efforts. Yet when seeds fall on "good soil," the crop yield is abundant — up to a hundred times what was sown (Matthew 13:8).

That parable emphasizes the need for hearts to be receptive to God's Word. But it's also a reminder to plant Scripture persistently. Just as soil and weather conditions change, so may someone's attitude toward following Jesus. Pastor J. Ellsworth Kalas writes, "Whenever we serve as witnesses to the faith, we must do so with all earnestness, because one doesn't know the season in which the soul currently abides. That uninterested, distracted or unresponsive person may be nearer the Kingdom than we — or they — realize." Kalas adds, "We dare not give up on anyone at any time — including ourselves."

A prayer for strength...

God of inexhaustible strength and limitless energy, our refuge, strength and very present help in trouble: When even youth faint in weariness and the young fall exhausted, help us wait patiently for you to come to renew our strength, so that we will mount up with wings to soar like eagles, riding on the undercurrents of the wind of your Spirit.
