Lead A Life Worthy of the Calling

"I, therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called... " (Ephesians 4:1)

What is to live a life worthy of calling? If we look at the context where it is written, we know that we are called to be connected to the other members of the body and learn to follow Christ, building up one another.

God institutes a church as the body of Christ to express God's love and purpose for the world. It is a mystery. God never calls a church to be perfect. And he continues, "Wretched man that I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord. (v24, 25)

Therefore, Church is a group of people who dare to be vulnerable, saying, 'I need you, and You also need me. "Unlike our expectation, Church is a messy place. Because it is a messy place, the church is a place filled with song, 'Grace greater than our sins."

God intends our faith to be personal yet communal, not private. We are members of one body. God calls us to be a church to learn how to live together with all our differences of skin color, class, values, sexuality, or political views. Living together as a church is a prophetic calling in our divisive world.

Going forward, we have asked if we can utilize some of our Sunday school time assisting with pre-work we might can help with in the run-up to VBS.
