The Finance Committee is still working toward offering a Financial Training small group study to start in later 2024. Everett Baker and Jackie Mulvey will be leading the study.

A new finance policy is being established for the creation of new Ministry Groups. No new ministry will be initiated without approval of both the Finance Committee and the Church Council.
