"St. Paul UMC's Journey to the Discernment Process"

Greetings, St. Paul UMC family!

I hope you stay in God's grace in the season of change and abundance.

As I announced, the church council decided to start the discernment process. I want to explain what we will go through down the road with some background.

Since the 2016 General Conference, the UMC has tried to settle a resolution about the long-struggling issue of homosexuality. Therefore, at the 2019 special session of the General Conference, UMC added ¶2553 to the Book of Discipline. It is about the process of local churches' disaffiliation due to the issue. In addition to the ¶2553, each Annual Conference of the UMC sets up a guideline to help local churches that consider disaffiliation.

According to the BWC's guideline, the local churches need to start a 'church activity-based discernment process' if local churches think about disaffiliation. It has five steps, and our District Superintendent initiates the process. (https://www.bwcumc.org/news-and-views/trustees-outline-process-for-disaffiliation/)

### 1. A viewing of "Stay or Go: Real Talk for United Methodists Exploring Their Future."

=> Congregations are asked to view the BWC webinar recorded in the Spring of 2022 called "Stay or Go: Real Talk for United Methodists Exploring Their Future." This webinar is a discussion with panelists from UM Next and the Wesleyan Covenant Association as they answered questions about their visions for ministry after separation.

## 2. Study, Living Faithfully: Human Sexuality and The United Methodist Church, (Abingdon Press, 2017).

=> This is a four-week small group study with an honest approach to the matter. Each chapter of this study includes stories from diverse viewpoints referring to the United Methodist structure and practices to guide the group's reflection and conversation.

- **3.** An open forum where a safe space will be created for questions and answers that have arisen after the steps above. The forum will include the District Superintendent.
- **4.** The District Superintendent will assist congregants who are interested in transferring their membership to another UMC congregation if their church conference decides to disaffiliate.
- **5.** The general terms and conditions from the Conference Board of Trustees and the calculation of the church's withdrawal liability payment from the Conference Board of Pensions should be shared with all professing members of the congregation.
- => Similar to the actions taken after a church vote to close, it is the responsibility of the district superintendent to assist congregants who are interested in transferring their membership to another UMC congregation should the church conference decide to disaffiliate. The congregation will also have access to Wespath resources that help to explain the Withdrawal Liability Payments and the impact of disaffiliation on Clergy Benefits.

Defining an activity-based discernment process, which can be used by all BWC churches, will help to alleviate the concerns within a congregation that could arise with a less structured approach. The intent of the process is to provide a fair discussion about the disaffiliation matters that is, at the same time, not too cumbersome on a congregation and its leaders.

Once we start the process, please participate in each step actively, and share your questions, thoughts, struggles, and comments. Dear members of St. Paul UMC, it should be you who can decide St. Paul's future, and it is your responsibility to take care of St. Paul UMC. Please take time and pray, and participate in each process. It's in your hands.

It's a discernment process. It is a process we need to take as a church to discern St. Paul's future life and ministry. It will help us to think and discern each one's thoughts and beliefs about the issue. We will take enough time and go through the process.

Maybe you want to ignore it because it's a complex and heavy issue to carry on. But if we put our heads into the sand and forget it, it will be messier. It is time to get together and pray more, share each other's thoughts and listen to each other with love and sound hearts. St. Paul UMC is the church that God called us to work with for the mission of God's Kingdom. God will ask us one day what we did with it. Please be patient with us, pray with us, and for us.





Call the Prayer Chain when you need a prayer for yourself or others. Activate it by calling anyone on the list anytime, day or night.






