"Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me."

- Psalm 51:10 -

Dear Beloved St. Paul United Methodist Church family,

As we enter the sacred season of Lent, I am reminded of the words of the prophet Joel: "Return to the Lord with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments" (Joel 2:12-13). Lent is a time to pause, reflect, and draw closer to God. It is a season of spiritual renewal, a journey that prepares our hearts for the joy of Easter.

For forty days, we walk with Jesus in the wilderness, confronting our own temptations, weaknesses, and distractions. It is a time to examine our lives, repent our sins, and recommit ourselves to living as disciples of Christ. Through prayer, fasting, and acts of service, we create space in our hearts for God to work in and through us.

Lent is not meant to be a season of despair but of hope. It reminds us that even in our brokenness, God's grace is sufficient. As we deny ourselves, we are reminded of the ultimate sacrifice Christ made for us on the cross. His love calls us to live differently—to love more deeply, to forgive more freely, and to serve more selflessly.

This Lent, I encourage you to embrace the disciplines of the season.

*Set aside time each day for prayer and Scripture reading with the reading schedule.

*Consider fasting from something that distracts you from God, whether it's a habit, a food, or a form of entertainment.

*Use the time and resources you save to bless others, whether through acts of kindness, giving to those in need, or volunteering in our community.

The St. Paul UMC Trustees meet on the first **Saturday** of each month for their business meeting and work time around the church campus. Items discussed include church projects, church maintenance and finances. Additional work sessions are scheduled as needed to maintain the facilities and complete projects. Any volunteer help is welcomed.



Completed projects in the month of January include:

- 1) Scrubbed, washed and waxed 5 classroom floors in CLC
- 2) Reorganized janitor's closet in CLC and installed new shelving units for organization
- 3) Repaired sinks and faucets in the CLC
- 4) Completed fire suppression inspection in the CLC kitchen
- 5) Repaired locks on 2 doors in SPUMPS classrooms

Upcoming projects include:

- On hold: SPUMC Home Mission Project The Trustees are planning to rehab the current Fellowship Hall adjacent to the sanctuary. James Ritter is spearheading the project. Dates to follow to lend a hand with cleaning out the closets, drywall, insulation, flooring, ceiling tiles, etc.... This is a facelift that is LONG overdue!
- 2) Paint the church office
- 3) Replace broken light fixtures in the CLC Activity Center
- 4) Replace broken rope on flag pole next to the Sanctuary—need fire company support
- 5) Create signage to include direction signs to Sanctuary, CLC, and Fellowship Hall
- 6) Continue floor stripping, scrubbing and waxing classrooms in CLC.
- 7) Rekey locks for doors into the CLC

Many thanks to the very dedicated team of Trustees who put in countless hours to maintain our beautiful campus.

The trustees maintain a detailed list of projects across our campus and are working to complete them. Please inform a trustee if you see any area that needs repair and/or if you have an idea for improvement. We want St. Paul UMC to be an inviting, safe space for all to worship and fellowship.

St. Paul's greeting card ministry has completed its 2024 inaugural year and what a year we have had! 268 cards were distributed this year for **birthdays** (to staff & our youngest church attendees), sympathy, medical (good health test results/ sickness/ injuries/ surgery/hospital stays/get well/cancer support), **praying for you**, thank you's (committees and for church events), celebrations (baptism, HS graduations, joining the church, grandchildren birth), thinking of you (members not seen in a while), cards for servicemen (birthday plus holidays), recognitions (inc. Administrative (Secretary's) Professional Day, Pastor Appreciation, new church membership, welcome new staff, school/professional honors), collegiate (birthdays & good luck during exams), and visitor welcome. 
A special thank you to Susan Baker for stepping in to cover our February 16th Kindergarten to Grade 2 class.



Bishop LaTrelle Easterling hosted a Town Hall on **Revitalization and Restructuring** on Tuesday, February 11th.

She and conference leaders outlined plans for collaborative hubs, made up of 5 to 12 churches; Connecting Churches, which will facilitate the work of the hubs; the six new geographic districts, and a timeline for the implementation of the restructuring.

The changes ahead "will require discipline, intentionality and a willingness to change," the bishop said. 


