TRUSTEES ***JIM HOUSE, CHAIR***

The St. Paul UMC Trustees meet on the first **Saturday** of each month for their business meeting and work time around the church campus. Items discussed include church projects, church maintenance and finances. Additional work sessions are scheduled as needed to maintain the facilities and complete projects. Any volunteer help is welcomed!



Completed projects in the month of January include:

- 1) Scrubbed, washed and waxed CLC kitchen floor
- 2) Buffed CLC hallway floors
- 3) Repaired batting cage in CLC and cleaned up that area
- 4) Replaced broken light fixtures in CLC Activity Room
- 5) Replaced door stops in CLC
- 6) Repaired fixture in men's bathroom
- 7) Replaced batteries in smoke detectors

Upcoming projects include:

- 1) Repair 2 HVAC Units that were damaged during power surge in fall.
a. Note: The \$10,000 repair cost was submitted to our insurance company and they are covering all costs minus \$2500 deductible.
- 2) Repair parking lot damage next to cemetery
- 3) On hold: SPUMC Home Mission Project - The Trustees are planning to rehab the current Fellowship Hall adjacent to the sanctuary. James Ritter is spearheading the project. Dates to follow to lend a hand with cleaning out the closets, drywall, insulation, flooring, ceiling tiles, etc.... This is a facelift that is LONG overdue!
- 4) Paint the church office
- 5) Replace broken rope on flag pole next to sanctuary – need fire company support
- 6) Create signage to include direction signs to sanctuary, CLC, and fellowship hall
- 7) Rekey locks for doors into the CLC

Many thanks to the very dedicated team of Trustees who put in countless hours to maintain our beautiful campus.

The trustees maintain a detailed list of projects across our campus and are working to complete them. Volunteers are always welcome! Please inform a trustee if you see any area that needs repair and/or if you have an idea for improvement. We want St. Paul UMC to be an inviting, safe space for all to worship and fellowship.

February financials reviewed during March Finance Committee Meeting. Challenges continue for operating expenses to be higher than general unrestricted income.

Finance Policy review / update. New Policy for Reimbursement of Expenses being reviewed by Finance Committee. The policy will provide guidelines for timing of reimbursement requests with 90 days of receipt date for reimbursement or within calendar year for inclusion on annual giving statement without reimbursement.

Upcoming Rise-Against-Hunger event scheduled for April. The event cost is \$4,300 and to date we have received approximately \$2,355

We are in the season of Lent which is a 40-day period of reflection and preparation for Easter that Christians observe. It's a time to remember Jesus's suffering, death, and resurrection.

As a reminder, the purpose of Lent is:

- To ask for forgiveness
- To prepare to celebrate Jesus's resurrection at Easter
- To test self-discipline
- To imitate Jesus's time of fasting and prayer in the desert

Christian practices can include:

- Prayer
- Fasting
- Participating in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation
- Abstaining from luxuries
- Reading Sacred Scripture
- Sharing time and talents



As we go through Lent together, take time to read the Lenten scriptures, participate in Rise Against Hunger, pray for guidance, and be prepared to celebrate Christ rising together on Easter morning. Garber daisies can be purchased in memory or honor of someone that will be in the sanctuary on Palm and Easter Sundays. Orders were due March 16th.

As a reminder, at our August “Wind in Our Sails” meeting, our congregation set three priorities for the upcoming year. In order, they were:

- 1) **Continue with ONE service.** It is such a joy having all of us together each Sunday. Morning worship starts at 9:15 with praise music and announcements are at 9:30 am. Fellowship time follows, and Sunday School begins around 10:45 am.
- 2) **We want our church to GROW** so our second priority will be publicity through Facebook, flyers, community outreach and more. Each person is encouraged to bring someone new to worship or one of our monthly activities.
- 3) The 3rd focus area is **financial stability**. We have made positive changes in budget and for that we are grateful, but our income last year was still below expenses. The 2025 budget is leaner than 2024 and we will continue to tighten our purse strings. Please consider your giving now and in the future towards the general budget.
