"Who do you think you are?"

Greetings!

First, please read Numbers chapter 13 in the Old Testament.

The 12 spies returned from exploring the Promised Land at the end of forty days. Here, we have the only statement on which they could agree: "It flows with milk and honey." Then they continue with the report: "Yet..." Have you noticed how often people are inclined first to say something good about a person or situation, but before long, they come out with a negative statement that cancels out the good?

"Yet, we saw the Nephilim there. There is no way that we could take the land. They are giants, and we are like grasshoppers compared to them." (Numbers 13:33)

How could the people of God identify themselves with grasshoppers? Didn't they have God's promise? Moses declared, "See, the Lord your God has given you the land. Go up and take possession of it as the Lord, the God of your fathers, told you. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged" (Deuteronomy 1:21). God promised that wherever the soles of their feet were placed, it would be theirs.

They were victimized by what they saw with their naked eyes: the giant. It happened to the Jews when they forgot why they got out of Egypt – to possess the Promised Land. Well, they are not the only ones. It happens to us also when we lose our sense of purpose and direction. In other words, when we lose hope. When we lose the purpose God placed in us, we begin to compare ourselves with the size of the giant things we can see with our naked eyes – bigger cars, bigger houses, bigger churches, more significant jobs, etc.

The consequence was tough. The first generation of the Jews who came out from Egypt all died in the wilderness, and the second generation roamed around the wilderness for forty years to restore their identity before God due to their disobedience. In other words, they didn't have the eyes of faith and hope. Our God is not a God of grasshoppers.
