"Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say, rejoice!"

Sundays from September 24th to October 15th, we have a lectionary reading 'Philippians,' a Paul's letter to a faith community in Philippi. He started a church in Philippi on his second mission trip in 51 A.D. He wrote this letter about 10 years later while imprisoned in Rome. The letter's central theme is 'Rejoice!' Therefore, as we hear Paul's teaching with Philippians, let's find out what 'joy' is for Christians.

Joy is the very nature of God and Christianity. When God created the world in Genesis, God said, 'It was good.' Imagine the face of God when God said that "it was good." Do you imagine a smiling God? Do you imagine God whose face has a grin on it? Some sneer at Christians, saying that they are always serious. Even some Christians associate the image of being holy with one of being severe and solemn. Being holy is setting ourselves apart from the world's cultural values and living according to God's will.

Joy is a mark of a Christian. It is a fruit of the Spirit. In Jesus' coming into our life, the angels announced (Luke 2:10-11), 'I bring us the good news of great joy!' because Jesus is the good news of joy. Jesus freed people from any limitations and bondages when he did his ministry. The truth enlightened the intellect after their long journey of searching. The ordinary were released from the fear of death and delivered from the guilt of sin. The lonely realized that Jesus was their everlasting friend. People were filled with joy and couldn't help going out to spread the good news to others. The list is endless.

Think about yourself. What good news has Jesus brought to your life? Doesn't that give you more than enough reason to rejoice?

- I rejoice because Jesus is my reason to live for. He is worth living and dying for. He is my Savior, best friend, hiding place, and rock.

- I rejoice because all of you share that joy with me.
- I rejoice with you who want to know God's Word, Love, Grace, and Truth more.

- I rejoice with you getting closer to God and being changed little by little by the grace of God.

- I rejoice with you striving to practice Biblical principles at your workplace.

- I rejoice with you going out and seeking the justice of God.

- I rejoice with you finding St. Paul United Methodist Church your spiritual home, so you don't want to hold your urge to talk with your friends about how good the church is.

- I rejoice with you, filled with God's creative Spirit, that you want to start something new with the church.

- I rejoice with you brooding over new ideas for reaching new families, raising awareness of our natural environment, expanding our mission and service, and reaching new people.

- I rejoice because these things are actually happening among you.

They are neither stories of our glorious past nor wishful thinking about our unknown future. They are stories we are currently writing that I'm witnessing with my own eyes.

- I rejoice because these are signs that God's creative Spirit is hovering over us.

- I rejoice because the joy of the Lord is our strength that will enable us to get through any possible hurdles, we may jump over while we seek the kingdom of God and bless others.

More than anything else, I rejoice... because God loves you.

I rejoice... because you are my joy.

Our St. Paul UMC family has much to be thankful for over the last few weeks. We had wonderful participation at the "Wind in our Sails" congregational planning meeting on August 19th and 48 folks spent a beautiful Saturday morning together sharing their joys of St. Paul and their hopes for the future. It was an amazing time together and I am still smiling every time I think of the day. The afternoon was spent identifying our three top priorities of "new" ideas.

Outcome #1: A Combined Worship Service – We are piloting a new, combined service on September 10, 17 and 24 at 9:00 am in the Sanctuary. The Praise Band will be moving over, and our congregation will all be together, in one space, for worshipping and praising together. Fifty nine folks joined us for the first of these services on September 10th and all were asked to provide feedback in the form of a survey. The upcoming Combined Services will be tweaked based on the feedback that was received. The Church Council will also be reviewing the feedback from the services and use that to make decisions about worship services in the future. Please complete your survey if you haven't done so yet.

Outcome #2: More Fellowship Opportunities – A fellowship hour has been added immediately following the Combined Worship Service and will be in the Activity Center (aka CLC). A light breakfast will be served with pastries, fruit, coffee and juice. About 40 folks came to the first one on September 10th and a wonderful time was had by all chatting and learning more about each other. If you would like to volunteer to assist with the fellowship hours, let me know. Donations will also be welcomed.

Outcome # 3: More Family and Congregational Activities – Many folks want to have more family and congregational activities where we invite our congregation and others to join us. With the retirement of Pastor Dave and Debby, our SPPRC was looking for a new youth leader. God sent us Sherry Mervine, aka choir director too, to fill this vacancy. She has come to us with MANY ideas and is our new Children and Youth Leader. Monthly activities are planned to bring families and our congregation together. Please plan to join us for the very first one on

September 24th in the Activity Center at 11:30 am. A "Fun Family Fiesta and Fellowship" is planned for Hispanic Heritage Month. Please RSVP your attendance.
