The risen Lord is going ahead of you.

Greetings! We are in the Easter season, celebrating Jesus' resurrection. Jesus is alive! And the risen Lord is with us and leads us in God's way.

Let's look at the Easter story from Mark 16. When women visited Jesus' tomb after the Sabbath, they found the empty tomb. And they met a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side. He said, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him" (v6). The truth of Jesus' resurrection assured the disciples that to continue to go on a journey as witnesses to God's Kingdom work. Jesus' resurrection contains the truth that not only God is bigger than our limits, the death, but also God is not dead but alive. And this living God is with us, and it's the truth that helps us to live our lives as God's children. The truth that God is with us always comforts us, enables us to endure what we have, and encourages us to move on from unpleasant or unwanted situations.

As you have heard, St. Paul United Methodist Church Council decided to stop the discernment process in April. Some people were happy with this decision, and others were not. As a church family, we had tried to make a decision together, but after we started it, we didn't have enough participation to proceed with the process from the congregation. The council members prayed and talked to each other about its meaning and decided to stop the process. (Please check out the lay leader's (Donna House) article for more information) I understood that people who were not happy with the result would leave the St. Paul UMC and find a faith community to go on their spiritual journey according to their faith. Yes, as you feel, it is heartbreaking, and it is always to say goodbye to people who have been with us. We make life decisions according to our beliefs, which is proper; however, sometimes, our choices involve heartbreaking experiences.

All St. Paul UMC's people who decided to stay in the United Methodist Church and people who chose to leave the United Methodist Church feel heartbreak, and I feel sorry for you ALL experiencing it now. Whether you decide to stay or go, I, as pastor of the St. Paul UMC, remind you the truth that God is with God's people... ALL people.

You may feel uncertain about the current and future situation of your personal and the St. Paul UMC's spiritual journey. Please think about the women who were heading to Jesus' tomb. As you can imagine, the women felt darkness, uncertainty, and worry. However, God met them and gave them a new direction that Jesus would go ahead of them. And Jesus did. Like the scripture and God's promise, God will be with you, and God will go ahead of you all and lead you in God's way.

Let's not judge but love and bless each other. Let's keep each other in our prayers. John Wesley said, "Agree to disagree." It would be ok to have different opinions, theology, and interpretations of the scriptures. Please think about how many denominations are in the world. Their theology and understanding of the scripture are different. And we don't judge them because God's love is bigger than our thoughts, and God's way is higher than ours. Each denomination, each church, and each individual is a part of God's Kingdom. Let's humbly take the truth to our lives and do our best wherever we go and whatever we do to let God's Kingdom come on earth as it is in heaven.

God's unconditional and unbounded love is for ALL God's people, whether we decide to stay or go. And sincere God will go with and ahead of all of us. May God bless all of you and your journey.

the 2019 general conference\_of the UMC, a temporary rule, called paragraph 2553, was added explaining the disaffiliation process for local churches wanting to leave the UMC due to human sexuality issues. The BW Conference asked any local churches wanting to disaffiliate to vote by April 28, 2023. Back in May 2022, St. Paul UMC provided an opportunity to learn about the differences between the United Methodist Church and the Global Methodist Church even before we started the discernment process.

On November 10, 2022, St. Paul Church Council voted to begin the 5 step discernment process to help the St. Paul UMC congregation learn about the issue. Specific participation numbers were identified to ensure that this was a church activity-based process that involved the whole church. Pastor Baek sent a 6 page letter via US mail to all 300+ members on December 6th, outlining the specifics of each step. This was also emailed to all via our church email list. The steps included: Viewing of a video, a four-week book study, an open forum, special church conference to vote and finally the payment due to the BW Conference for withdrawal from the UMC of more than \$1.2 million.

Step 1 was the viewing of the Stay or Go video that we have been advertising at each service and in our bulletin since December. The Church Council deemed 81 people needed to report that they watched the video before we moved on to step 2, the book study. As of today, we have had 46 members report they have watched the Stay or Go video. The council decided the specification to make this process happen by the 'church family,' not by just a few.

As the lay leader of the St. Paul UMC, I want to make this announcement to my beloved St. Paul UMC congregation: **The St. Paul UMC' s Council met on Thursday, April 12th and voted to end the disaffiliation process since all the steps cannot be completed by the April 28th deadline.** We are a laity led congregation and our church is a welcoming church with our doors open for all. I am happy to report that St. Paul UMC will remain with the UMC and will continue to do God's Kingdom ministry to the people in Southern Maryland and beyond as a body of the United Methodist Church.

I appreciate all your prayers, participation, and support to the St. Paul United Methodist Church. This has been a challenging time and we pray that through all of this, that St. Paul will continue to grow and be a vibrant church. Remember our vision statement: St Paul UMC is a Christ-centered family that offers HOPE, by responding to God's love and grace as Christian disciples. I look forward to our church family to continue our work for God's Kingdom.

b) Affiliate Member: Affiliate members are professing members of another United Methodist Church who may be temporarily far from their home congregation and wish to connect with the life, ministry, and watch care of a congregation nearer to where they now are for a time. They retain their memberships in their home church(UMC).

c) Associate member: Associate members are non-United Methodists currently located at some distance from their home church. They have been baptized by water in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit in another Christian denomination wish to connect with a local United Methodist Church but wishes to retain their current denominational affiliation rather than become professing members of The United Methodist Church while in their current location.




