Greetings to the beloved St. Paul UMC family and friends!

It is already November. According to the church calendar, we have reached the last month of 2024. Every year, our church has designated November as the ‘Month of Thanksgiving and observed it. Of course, there is Thanksgiving Day, but more than that, it is to conclude the year’s religious life with gratitude. As you know, the church calendar begins with ‘Advent’ and ends with ‘Thanksgiving’. This rhythm of the church calendar has a very important meaning for our religious life.

We Christians welcome the new year with ‘anticipation’ for the Lord’s return. It is in contrast to most people in the world who welcome the new year with the hope of their wishes being fulfilled. Why is that? It is because our understanding of the purpose of life is fundamentally different. Christians are people who live in the hope that the Lord will return and that God’s kingdom will be established on this earth. So, we start the year’s life to stand as ‘clean and well-prepared’ when the Lord comes again.

When we live so diligently and reach the end of the year, we end it with ‘thanks’ for God’s grace. But what is it that we are so thankful for? Is it because we spent the year without any difficulties? Is it because all our wishes come true? No. Rather, it is because the ‘day when we will see the Lord again’ has come that much closer. Although there were difficulties, our lives have matured that much because the kingdom ruled by the Lord has expanded that much more, and we were able to be used for that work to this extent.

That's right. Christian gratitude does not come and go depending on circumstances or conditions. We are thankful even when we have a lot, but we can be thankful even when we don't have much. We are thankful even when we are high up, and we are thankful even when we are healthy, but we can be thankful even when we are not because God's name will be honored through our lives in some way. I call this kind of Christian gratitude "all-season gratitude" because we can be thankful in any weather or situation.

However, it is not as easy as it sounds to be thankful to God when you are suffering from a serious illness. It is not easy to be thankful when you are having financial difficulties or experiencing unspeakable pain in your relationships with others. However, even in such cases, if we have faith, we can be thankful. Even if we do not understand why things are happening right now, we believe that God is working for us for some reason to give us the best.

That is why in his letter to the church in Thessalonica, Paul says, "In everything give thanks, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (1 Thessalonians 5:18) "In everything" literally means "all things." So we should be thankful for both good and bad things, when we are healthy and when we are sick. However, this is not a mandatory command to be thankful unconditionally, regardless of the reason. Here, we should pay attention to the word "for you." Being thankful for everything is ultimately GOOD FOR US. It is God's will that it be beneficial to us.

A 'grateful person' is a 'person of faith.' If we think of ourselves as a person of faith, I hope you will fill this month with 'gratitude.' First, be thankful for your close family members and family in faith. Express your heart with a card of gratitude. And above all, do your best to be thankful to God. If you end the year well by giving the fruits of gratitude in this way, you will begin the new year with even greater gratitude.

Let's be more thankful to God and each other.

The St. Paul UMC Trustees have changed their meeting day and now meet on the first Saturday of each month for their business meeting. They then break up into a work session and complete items on their never ending “To-Do list”. Items discussed include church projects, church maintenance and finances.



Completed projects in the months of September include:

1. Recruited and supported volunteers to clean the facility in Missy’s absence
2. Repainted the parking lot spaces and handicap symbols
3. Began scrubbing the CLC main hallway floor in preparation for waxing
4. Checked outside Ring cameras and batteries
5. Updated Facility Use form
6. Installed new hinges on SPUMPS wing exterior doors
7. Purchased new fire extinguishers for the parsonage

Upcoming projects include:

1. SPUMC Home Mission Project - The Trustees have decided to make the Saturdays in November our mission project to rehab the current Fellowship Hall adjacent to the sanctuary. James Ritter is spearheading the project. Please mark your calendars to lend a hand with cleaning out the closets, drywall, insulation, flooring, ceiling tiles, etc... This is a facelift that is LONG overdue!
2. Complete action items from 2024 parsonage inspection
3. Continue floor stripping, scrubbing and waxing of main hallway and classrooms in CLC.
4. Rekey locks for doors into the CLC
5. Schedule and inspect the fire suppressant system in kitchen

The trustees maintain a detailed list of projects across our campus and are working to complete them. Please inform a trustee if you see any area that needs repair and/or if you have an idea for improvement. We want St. Paul UMC to be an inviting, safe space for all to worship and fellowship.

Stewardship: In October, we began the annual stewardship campaign. Yellow pledge cards will be available in both the Church Office and Sanctuary vestibule. Financial commitment enables the church to plan for normal operating expenses and planned events for the upcoming calendar year.

2025 budget preparation: Committee budgets for 2025 will be due by November 10. Actual charges for 2023 and 2024 will be provided to each committee chair to aid in developing budget request. Along with funding, each committee will need to provide a plan for the funds being requested (not just specify a dollar amount).

2024 Finance Summary by month will be available upon request.

Year-End is not too far away.

Consider additional giving to St. Paul UMC General Fund or other Specific Mission planned event (such as Rise Against Hunger -2025).
