2024 BUDGET = \$347,066

As a non-profit, the budget assumes unrestricted income and expenses are equal for a net income of \$0.

Expenses continue to be higher than income each month.

Goal: Monitor financial status of St Paul United Methodist Church to support the continue upkeep of the facilities and support for the Mission and Evangelical activities of the church.

Stewardship: 2025 begins a new year of financial responsibility and reporting. The annual operating expense budget was approved by the Church Council at the December 2024 meeting. Continued monitoring and awareness is required to ensure the business of St Paul UMC will continue to support the church mission to serve the community and others.

2025 Operating Budget: \$347,066

Additional giving is encouraged to support the 2025 Rise Against Hunger event planned for Saturday April 12, 2025. This event will pack 10,000 meals which will be sent somewhere in the world where food insecurities exist. The meals packed in 2023 and 2024



were sent to Madagascar. This event has a cost of \$4,300 and additional giving is required to meet this mission critical commitment. As of 1/10/2025, we had approximately \$1,300 toward this goal and will continue to report on our progress through the end of March when payment is required.

TRUSTEES JIM HOUSE, CHAIR

The St. Paul UMC Trustees meet on the first **Saturday** of each month for their business meeting and work time around the church campus. Items discussed include church projects, church maintenance and finances. Additional work sessions are scheduled as needed to maintain the facilities and complete projects.



Completed projects in the months of December include:

- 1) Repaired Sanctuary Furnace
- 2) Cleaned all HVAC systems in SPUMPS classrooms
- 3) Replaced parsonage faucets in kitchen and master bathroom
- 4) Repaired water filter system for SPUMC campus
- 5) Repaired leaking faucet in bathroom between classrooms 12/14
- 6) Repaired loose door handle in women's bathroom in CLC
- 7) Repaired leaking faucet in women's bathroom in CLC
- 8) Moved drum set from sanctuary to undercroft
- 9) Scheduled inspection of fire suppressant system in CLC kitchen
- 10) Coordinated snow removal for parking lot and sidewalks

Upcoming projects include:

- 1) On hold: SPUMC Home Mission Project The Trustees are planning to rehab the current Fellowship Hall adjacent to the sanctuary. James Ritter is spearheading the project. Dates to follow to lend a hand with cleaning out the closets, drywall, insulation, flooring, ceiling tiles, etc... This is a facelift that is LONG overdue!
- 2) Paint the church office
- Create signage to include direction signs to sanctuary, CLC, and fellowship hall
- 4) Continue floor stripping, scrubbing and waxing classrooms in CLC.
- 5) Rekey locks for doors into the CLC

Many thanks to the very dedicated team of Trustees who put in countless hours to maintain our beautiful campus.

The trustees maintain a detailed list of projects across our campus and are working to complete them. Please inform a trustee if you see any area that needs repair and/or if you have an idea for improvement. We want St. Paul UMC to be an inviting, safe space for all to worship and fellowship.

As a reminder, at our August "Wind in Our Sails" meeting, our congregation set three priorities for the upcoming year. In order, they were:

- 1) **Continue with ONE service.** It is such a joy having all of us together each Sunday. Morning worship starts at 9:15 with praise music and announcements are at 9:30 am. Fellowship time follows, and Sunday School begins around 10:45 am.
- 2) We want our church to GROW so our second priority will be publicity through Facebook, flyers, community outreach and more. Each person is encouraged to bring someone new to worship or one of our monthly activities.
- 3) **Financial Stability**. We have made positive changes in budget and for that we are grateful but our income last year was still below expenses. The 2025 budget is leaner than 2024 and we will continue to tighten our purse strings. Please consider your giving now and in the future towards the general budget.






